
ELEGANT BANQUETTE SEATING

Hardware, and a Serena & Lily Hardware, and a Serena & Lily pendant.


TUFTED BLUE

STATEMENT IKAT



LUXURIOUS BLUE




EYE-CATCHING CHEVRON

WHITE LINEN




BOLD LINEN







GRAND ADVENTURE




BOLD MOVEMENT






MODERN COUNTRY BATHROOM

Carlo Cracco gives ED a tour of his new kitchen design for

Scavolini.

NEEDS



hen Scavolini, one of Italy's foremost kitchen brands, asked Italian master chef Carlo Cracco, of Milan's renowned Ristorante Cracco, to design a kitchen with them, it was a match made in heaven. Cracco, who has appeared on the Netflix series The Final Table, brought his knowledge of professional-kitchen organizing essentials to a domestic kitchen, leaving no detail unturned; for its part, Scavolini executed each piece to perfection using the innovative technology and superior manufacturing for which they are known. Thus, the MIA kitchen was born: It

includes glass cabinet fronts that become opaque when an internal light is turned off, a paneling system for the backsplash that can be customized with a vertical herb garden, and much more.

Following the success of this partnership, Scavolini was due to launch an updated version of the MIA kitchen, showcasing 12 new finishes, at Salone del Mobile for EuroCucina. But since the trade show was canceled, ED asked Cracco to share the key elements of this true chef's kitchen with us instead. 9 Things Every Kitchen Needs — 9 Things Every Kitchen Needs

1 GOOD MATERIALS



"Materials—like ingredients—are very important to me," Cracco says. "I specifically requested this stoneware for the countertops, backsplash, and even part of the flooring, as it is sourced locally from Lombardy and you can see it in the facades of buildings around Milan."

2 AN ORGANIZED BACKSPLASH

"The MIA kitchen offers a stylish solution for organizing your spices, bottles, and small utensils by offering containers and shelves that can be set along the sleek rails of the backsplash. You can also use it as a vertical garden to grow your fresh herbs."



3 PROPER VENTILATION



"Good ventilation is key. I designed a powerful hood that is also part of a metal shelving structure that can be used to organize different accessories. Form and function are blended perfectly in this solution."

4 GLASS CABINETS

"It's important to keep your small appliances and cooking utensils organized and neat. However, you also need to have them visible, as a chef cannot waste time looking for something. These Stopsol glass doors are great, because they have the ability to hide the contents within—they become opaque when the internal light is turned off."



5 A PULL-OUT CHOPPING STATION



"This is something that was uniquely designed for this kitchen. The chopping board pulls out, and it has a sideways drawer for knives and a waste bin underneath."

OUT OF CHINA











Out of China is located in the heart of Barcelona's Eixample district. A blue neon with the restaurant's name stands out of the main entrance. Inside, fine lamps illuminate the tables and cast their light on the oriental motifs. The waiters settle the guests in a bustling but elegant dining room while subtle music bathes the environment recalling the cosmopolitan Shanghai of the 1940s.

Founded in 2002, Out of
China offers a pioneering and
inclusive Chinese menu that
harmonizes traditional dishes
with contemporary flavours,
exotic aromas with local
ingredients. In other words, Out
of China balances masterfully
the old world with the new one
respecting the ancient Chinese
culinary techniques.

The idea for the graphics came from the colours and lights from the interior of the restaurant: royal blues, bright reds, dark furniture and wood. The outdoor neon inspired a visual structure for vertical titles while the delicate aromas of the oriental cuisine where captured to design volatile textures used to decorate surfaces. The cottony papers of G.F. Smith Colorplan played a key role as they are top quality while providing a very warm and pleasing touch.
