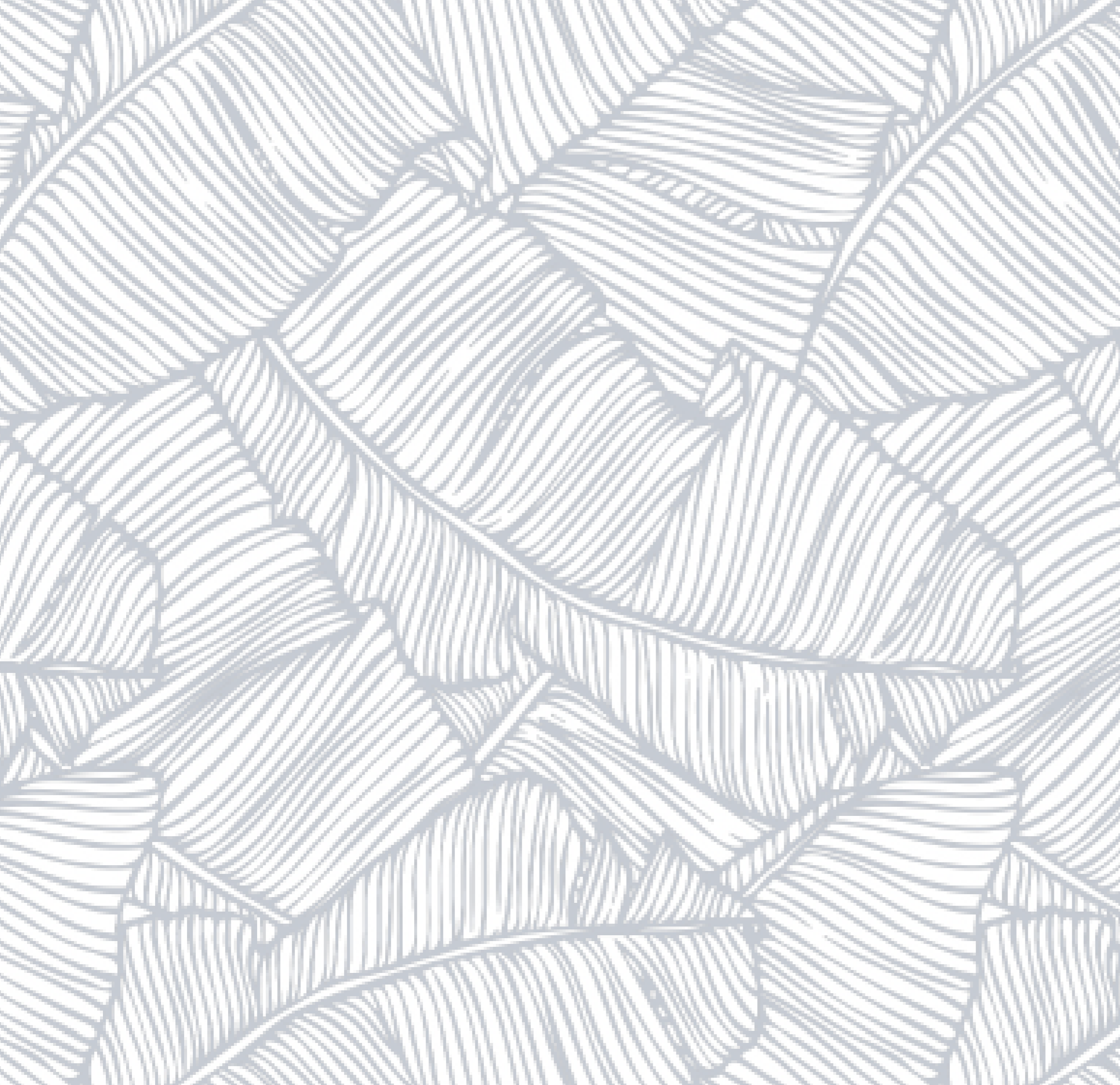

Warning: These living rooms will make you want to redecorate right now.

If you want to learn about someone's design aesthetic, look no further than their living room. As one of the most-frequented spots in the home—to be rivaled only by the kitchen—a living room sets the tone for the rest of the house. A



COZY UPSTATE LIVING ROOM

Three years after a fire broke out in the back of his home, designer Shawn Henderson restored his upstate New York space to be a soothing escape from the big city. This petite living room is undeniably serene, thanks to a Kaare Klint sofa, a chair by Kerstin Hörlin-Holmquist, and a versatile cocktail table courtesy of Frits Henningsen.



TRUE BLUE LIVING ROOM

It's no wonder that the living room packs the "wow" factor of this apartment on Manhattan's Upper East Side. Designer Stephen Sills paired the bright Lee Jofa wallcovering with a Louis XIV marble mantel and antique French chairs draped in a Clarence House silk.



CARTAGENA LIVING ROOM

Think of Chiqui de Echavarría's Colombian home as a passport-free way to travel the world. With an antique bench from India, South Africa-sourced paintings, and a Spanish Colonial sofa in a Palma de Mallorca fabric, this brick-clad living room has a true global edge.



HUDSON VALLEY LIVING ROOM

Sheila Bridges took her Hudson Valley, New York, living room to new heights (literally) with a mobile she co-designed with Elizabeth Parker. Rounding out the room is a Hammertown Barn sofa, a vintage side table, and a fireplace by Ortal.



CHIC LONDON LIVING ROOM

Decades after its last refurbishment in 1991, a well-known Kuwaiti family enlisted designer Nebihe Cihan to spruce up their charming London flat. Cihan used sculptural details and a jewel-toned sofa from Minotti to give the space a modern edge—without stripping it of its rich history.

LIMESTONE LIVING ROOM

Modern updates like industrial lighting and a polished cement floor create an eclectic aesthetic in this old-world living room. Cube-shaped poufs and linen-upholstered Bergère chairs add softness and texture.



A PATTERN-FILLED HOLLYWOOD LIVING ROOM

Actress Minnie Driver's inviting Hollywood living room features a mix of vintage fabrics and patterns. Window treatments in complementary colors add balance to the light-filled space.





A LIGHT-FILLED LIVING ROOM

White walls and contemporary furniture give this living room a clean and classic feel. Natural elements, by way of driftwood and greenery, bring the outdoors in.

CHRISTIANE LEMIEUX'S LIVING ROOM

Christiane Lemieux's New York City loft includes artwork by Robert Swain, custom sofas covered in a neutral linen, and a coffee table and side table from the Brimfield Show and a Paris flea market.



ART-FILLED HAMPTONS LIVING ROOM

Furniture doubles as art in this Hamptons home. A white sofa matching the wall and floors sets the stage for cream vintage Joe Colombo chairs that flank a custom Marmoreal coffee table. The Egan Frantz artwork spans the length of the sofa.



HISTORIC FARMHOUSE LIVING ROOM

The family room in a historic Long Island farmhouse boasts custom furnishings, including a sofa upholstered in a Lee Jofa fabric, a tufted sofa in a Chapas Textiles weave, a leather ottoman and a pair of armchairs covered in a Kravet linen blend. The 1950s cerused-oak side table and 19th-century copper lantern are French, the curtains are of a Home Couture fabric and the wallpaper is by Phillip Jeffries.



CALIFORNIA CASUAL LIVING ROOM

Exposed beams, a plaster fireplace, and wrought iron door frames create a Mediterranean vibe in this Newport, California home. A mix of cream upholstery with wood furniture and floors looks elegant but not fussy.



ART-FILLED MODERN LIVING ROOM

In the living room of a Manhattan apartment, a pair of 1960s chairs from John Salibello is in a Manuel Canovas fabric, the custom sofas are covered in Holland & Sherry fabrics, and the Karl Springer cocktail table (foreground) is from Mantiqes Modern;



STAR-STUDED LIVING ROOM

Designer Isabel López-Quesada refreshed this charming Madrid apartment—which the actress Ava Gardner used to call home—with soft, romantic details. Highlights include sofas reimaged in Brochier velvet, Pierre Paulin’s Mushroom chairs, and artwork by Donna Huanca.



TEXAS LIVING ROOM

In the living room, a Poul Henningsen light fixture and a Navajo rug in the family room; a cabinet by Robert “Mouseman” Thompson holds an Ansel Adams photograph, and the walls are painted in Benjamin Moore’s Cloud White.



LONG ISLAND SUMMER LOUNGE

Asked to update a beach house on Long Island that had become a mishmash after four decades of additions and renovations, David Mann decided to honor the past with its redesign. The den’s modular sofa is by Usona, and the ottoman is covered in a Kyle Bunting hair-on-hide leather; the photograph is by Darren Almond, the floor lamp is vintage, the rug is alpaca, and the walls and ceiling are painted in Benjamin Moore’s Super White.



NEW YORK CITY LIVING ROOM

In the West Village pied-à-terre of Los Angeles-based designers Waldo Fernandez and Tommy Clements, the daybed is by Rick Owens, the armchairs by Émile-Jacques Ruhlmann are upholstered in an alpaca by Perrine Rousseau and the side chairs are by Jean Prouvé.



NEW YORK RETREAT

An 18th-century sofa covered in a Fabricut fabric faces a wardrobe custom made from reclaimed wood and a Queen Anne corner chair in the bedroom of this Woodstock, NY home; the rug is vintage, the walls are painted in a custom C2 Paint color, and the ceiling and floors are of reclaimed wood.



MODERN CALIFORNIA LIVING ROOM

Designer Ernest de la Torre updated this Tudor-style home in Bel Air—which was built by Hollywood architect Paul R. Williams in 1934—with modern panache. A vintage Jean Royère chair and a rug by Edward Fields soften the sleek space.



ART NOUVEAU LIVING ROOM

When restoring her apartment in Tbilisi, Georgia, interior designer Eka Papamichael juxtaposed the space's rich Art Nouveau architecture with a vintage cocktail table, a Murano glass ceiling pendant, and sofas by Gervasoni.

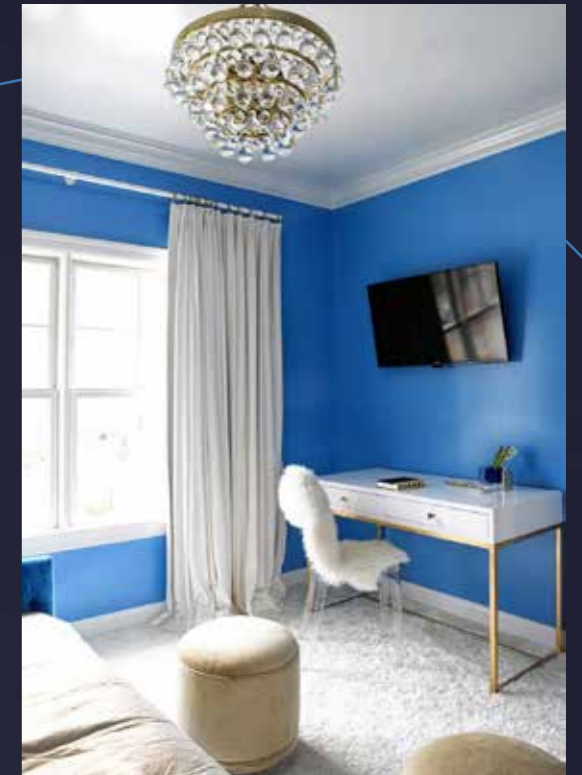

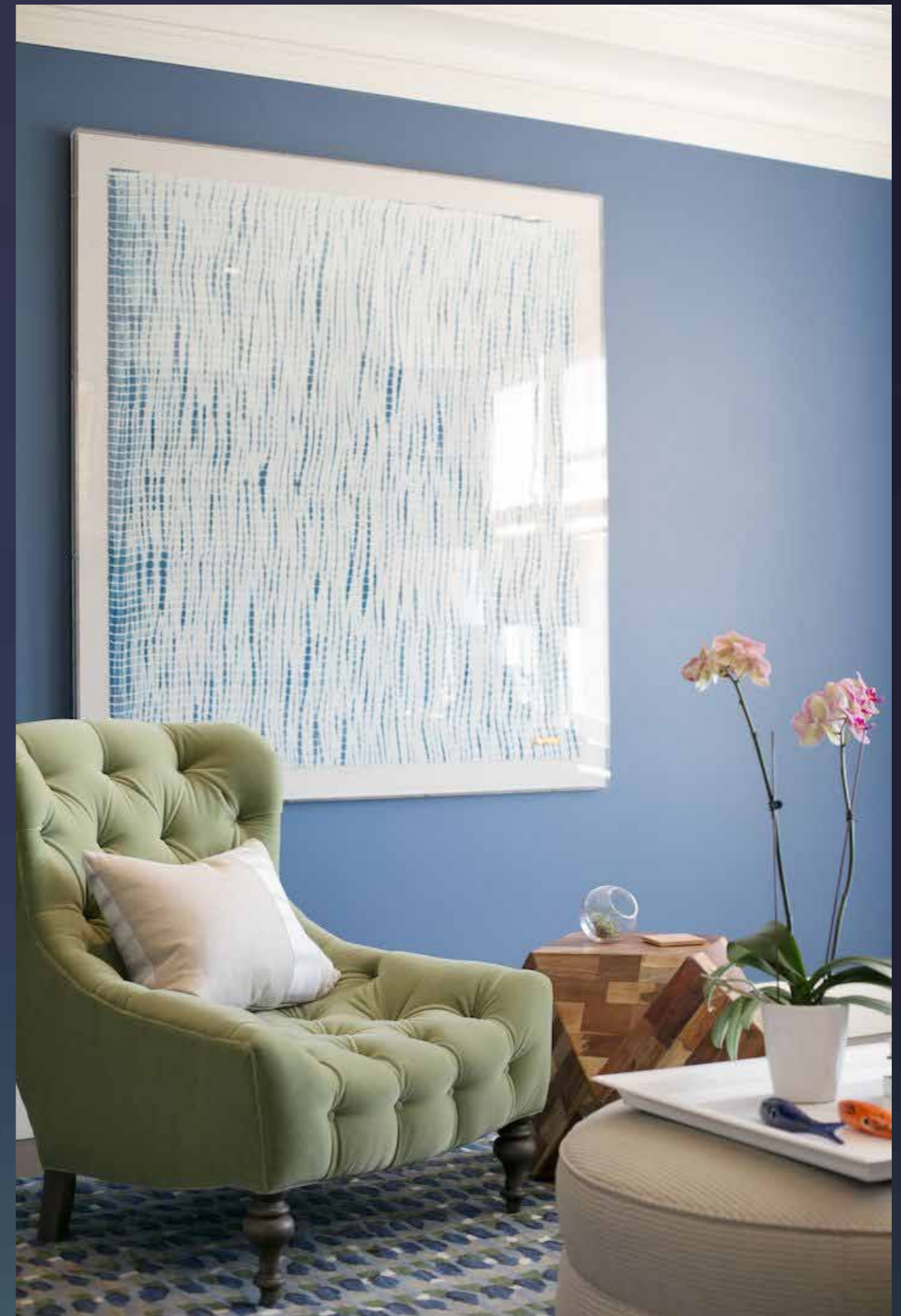

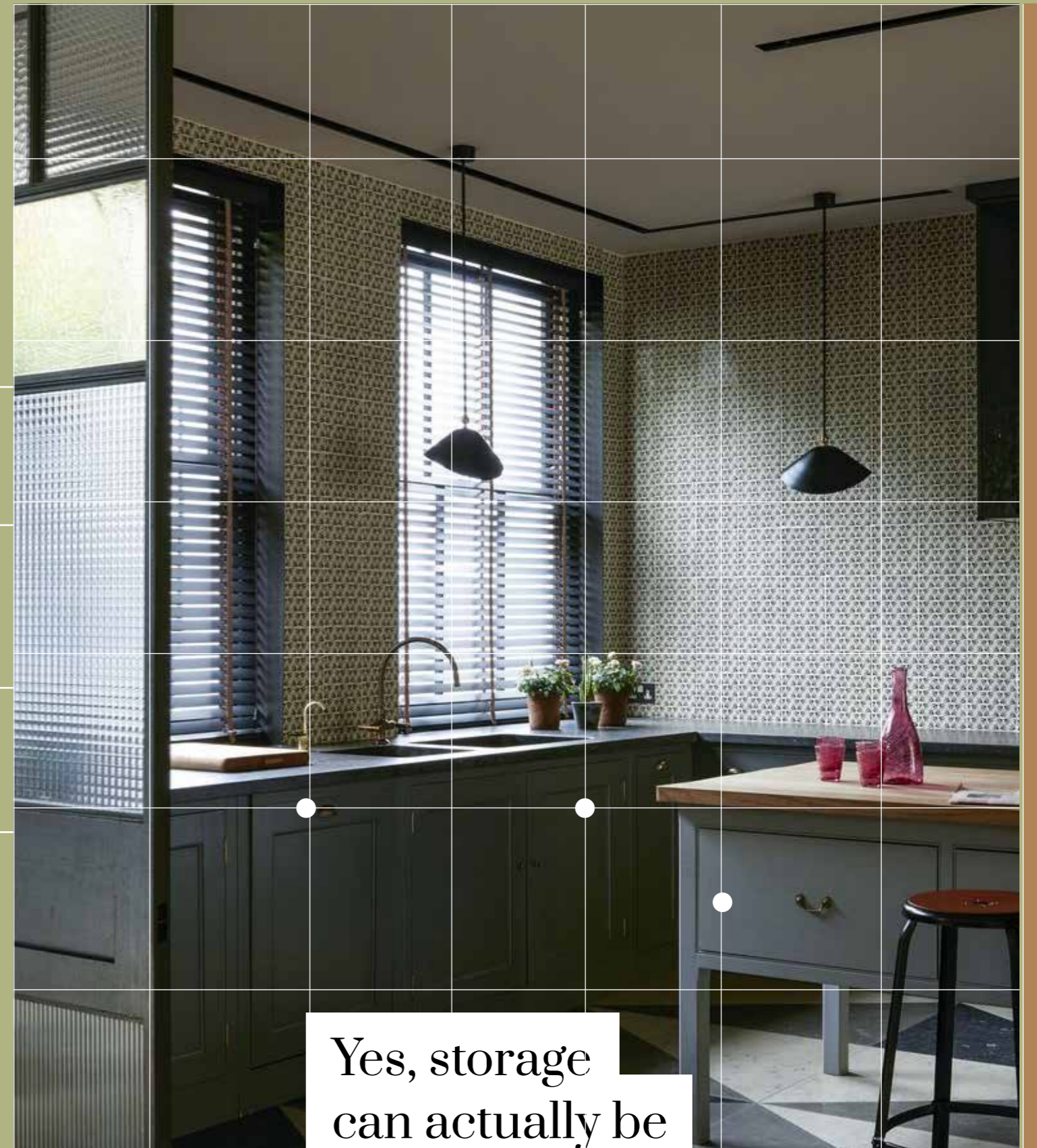

ACCENTS THAT SERVE BOTH FUNCTION AND FORM

A simple tray can do wonders for your kitchen when it comes to keeping organized. Instead of scattering items across your kitchen countertops—cream and sugar, fruit, mail—a decorative tray can create a sense of structure.



A WALL MOUNTED DISH RACK

The kitchen in Michael Bruno's Tuxedo Park home features a gorgeous wooden dish rack, perfect for storing dishes neatly and displaying decorative plates.

A GLASS-ENCLOSED ARMOIRE

For those with a stylish collection of dishware, a glass-enclosed armoire is a great way to display goods. Plus—it provides expanded storage real estate—and looks great, too.



VARIED CABINETRY

By opting for cabinets in varying sizes—deep drawers, wide doors, slim nooks—it is easier to store things based on shape, size, and type. Not only are you optimizing your storage, but you're also creating targeted zones for specific items.

FLOATING SHELVES AND MATCHING CERAMICS

This contemporary kitchen uses simple floating shelves to stash dishware, which all coordinate for an added touch of uniformity.





SHELVED ISLAND AND CURTAINED CABINET ORGANIZATION

A rustic kitchen is kept tidy with a shelved island for easy access to kitchenware, and unique curtained cabinets which keep other items out of site.



UNIFORM SHELVING ACCENTS

Simple shelving in an ultra-violet kitchen boasts a uniform feel, with coordinating decor. Matching planters and cups, monochromatic vases, and tall stacks of CD's make the space orderly and organized.



OPEN-SHELVED ORGANIZATION

Open shelving in this bright Connecticut kitchen puts dishware on display. It also features sink fittings by Waterworks, stools by York Street Studio, a range by Wolf and Benjamin Moore's White Dove on the walls.



RUSTIC SUBDUED SHELVING

This New York kitchen features a vintage marble island on a moveable steel base, and plenty of room for storing pots and pans. The pendant lights are from Rewire, the stove is by BlueStar, the shelves are made from reclaimed wood and the floor is made of concrete.

HANGING POTS

This bright and modern Pacific Palisades kitchen features a hanging pot rack to keep kitchenware in order. The barstools are from Organic Modernism, 1920s pendant lights are from Thanks for the Memories, the Carrara marble tiles are by Walker Zanger and the stove is by Viking.



GREEN AND WHITE CONTRASTING CABINETS

This stunning Houston home makes organization bold with its lower custom cabinets painted in a strié effect and the upper cabinets painted in Sherwin-Williams's Roman Column.





LACQUERED AND SLEEK

This modern Long Island kitchen has storage-friendly cabinetry, which is lacquered in a Ralph Lauren paint, a BDDW stool, fittings by Dornbracht and a walnut and stainless steel island. The sink is by Julien and the refrigerator and range are by Thermador.

SIMPLISTIC ORGANIZATION



This New York kitchen has a sink and fittings by Waterworks, a GE dishwasher, a vintage French artist's table that serves as the kitchen island, a Wolf stove and an original sign sitting on the ceiling beams.

KITCHEN ORGANIZATION IN A CELEB APARTMENT

This New York apartment features a bright galley kitchen with sleek cabinetry and a table by Eero Saarinen from Design Within Reach, Hans Wegner chairs purchased at an auction and a vintage pendant light by Max Ingrand for FontanaArte. The countertop is Calacatta Gold marble, the custom hood is by Vent-a-Hood, the range and microwave are by Wolf and the refrigerator is Sub-Zero.



ISLAND WITH DRAWERS

A London kitchen features 1955 pendant lights by Serge Mouille, wall tiles by Neisha Crosland, a floor made of three types of limestone and cabinetry by Plain English that is painted in Pure Grey 6 by Papers and Paints. The drawers in the kitchen island offer extra storage space.





MODERN WINE FRIDGE AND CLASSIC CABINETS

This New York estate's kitchen features Regency-style mahogany dining chairs from the 1940's, a vent hood by GE Monogram and a collection of antique and vintage copper cookware. And what's better than a wine refrigerator to keep your vino organized?



ULTRA MODERN ORGANIZATION

This pristine kitchen is located in New York and has plenty of drawers for easy storage. The countertop and sink are Corian, the fittings are by Vola, the light fixture is by Bega and the floor is terrazzo.



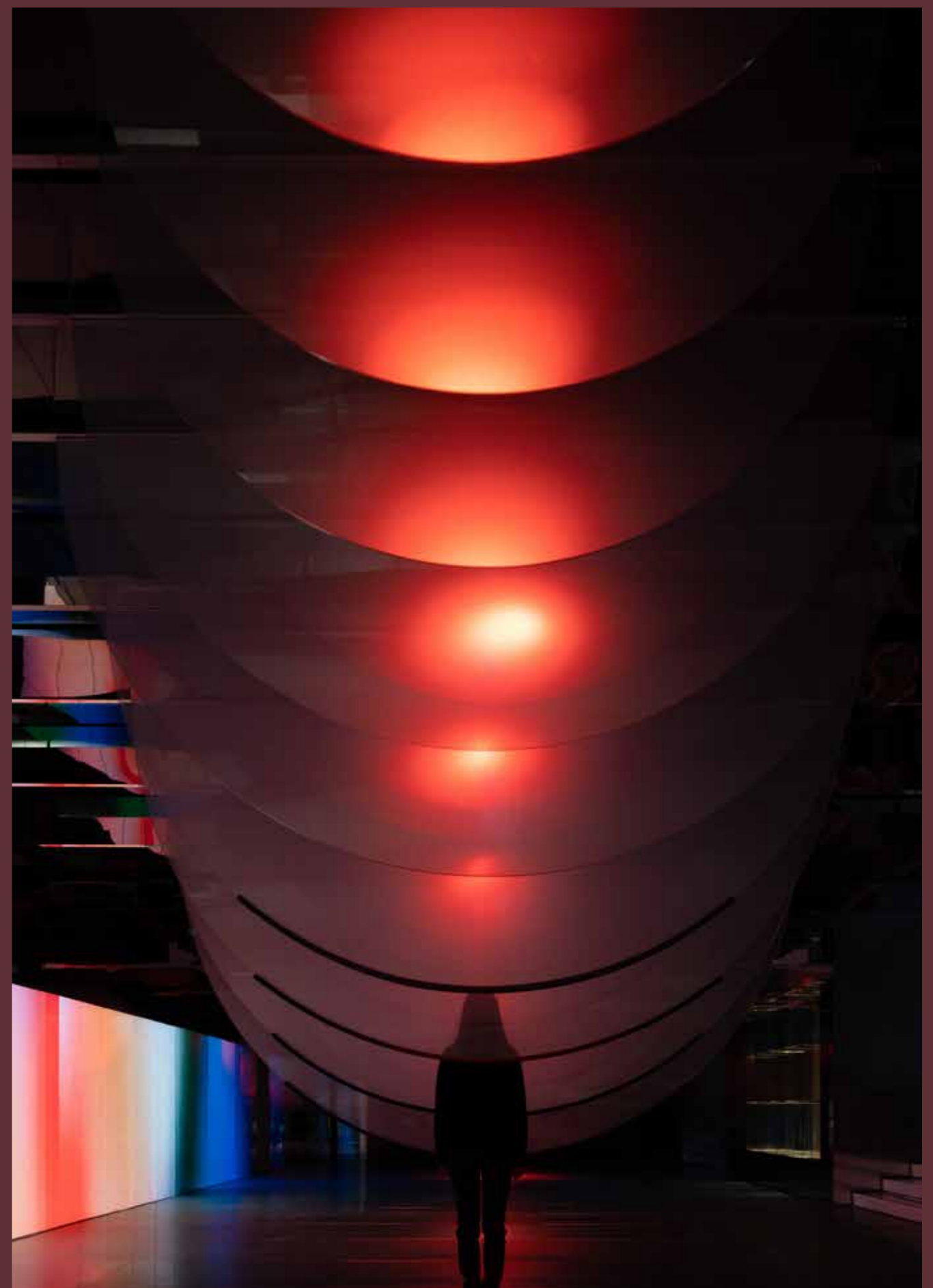
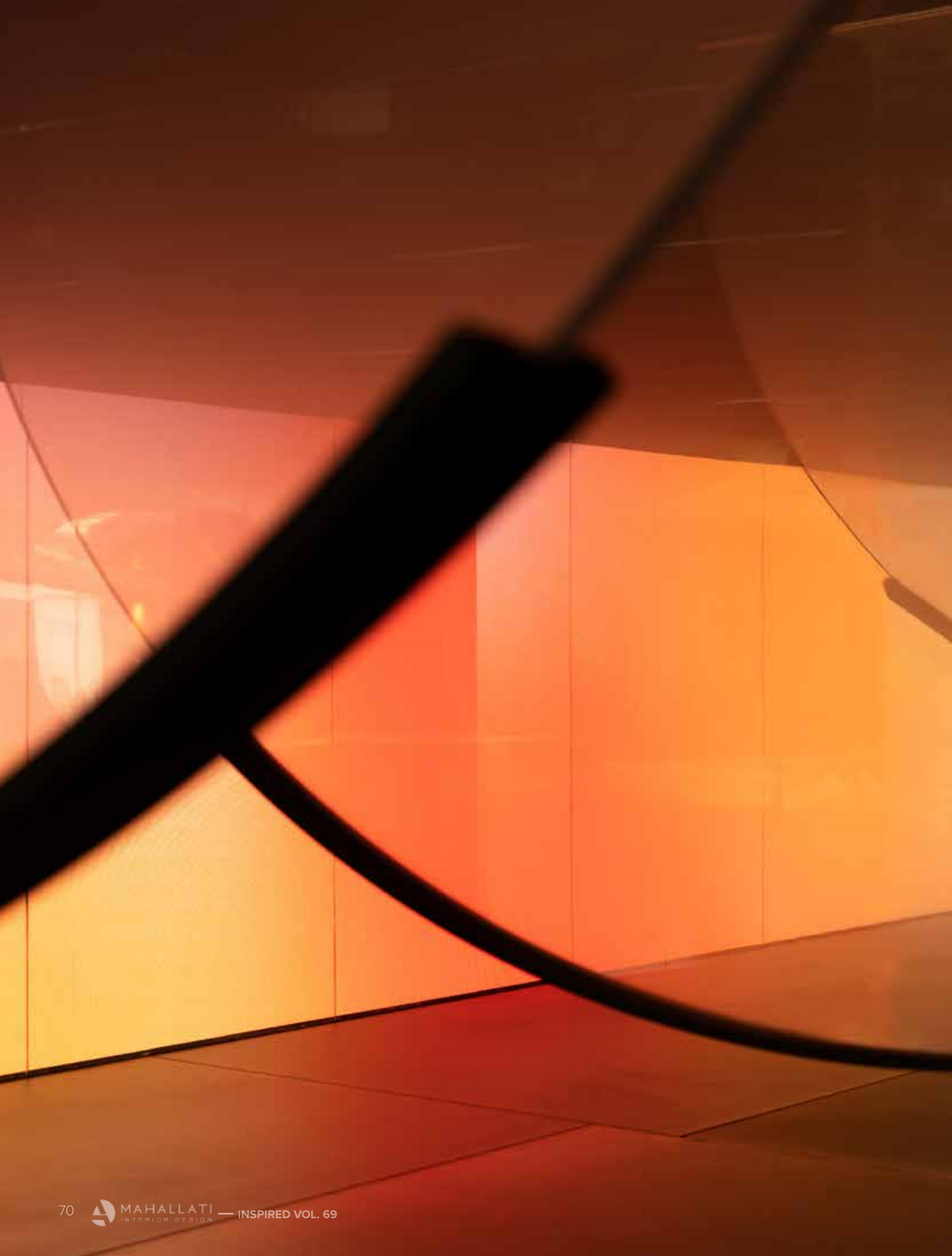

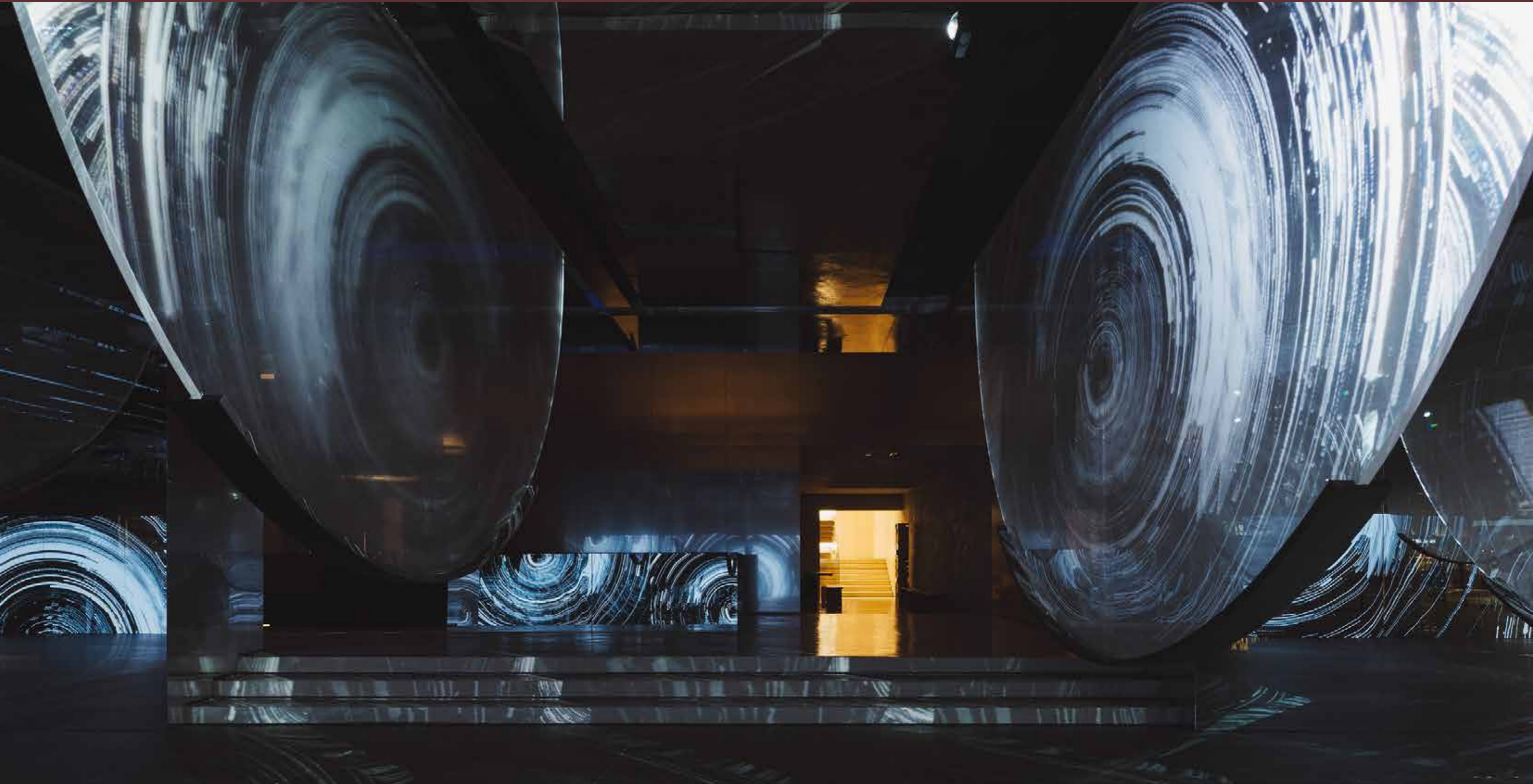
