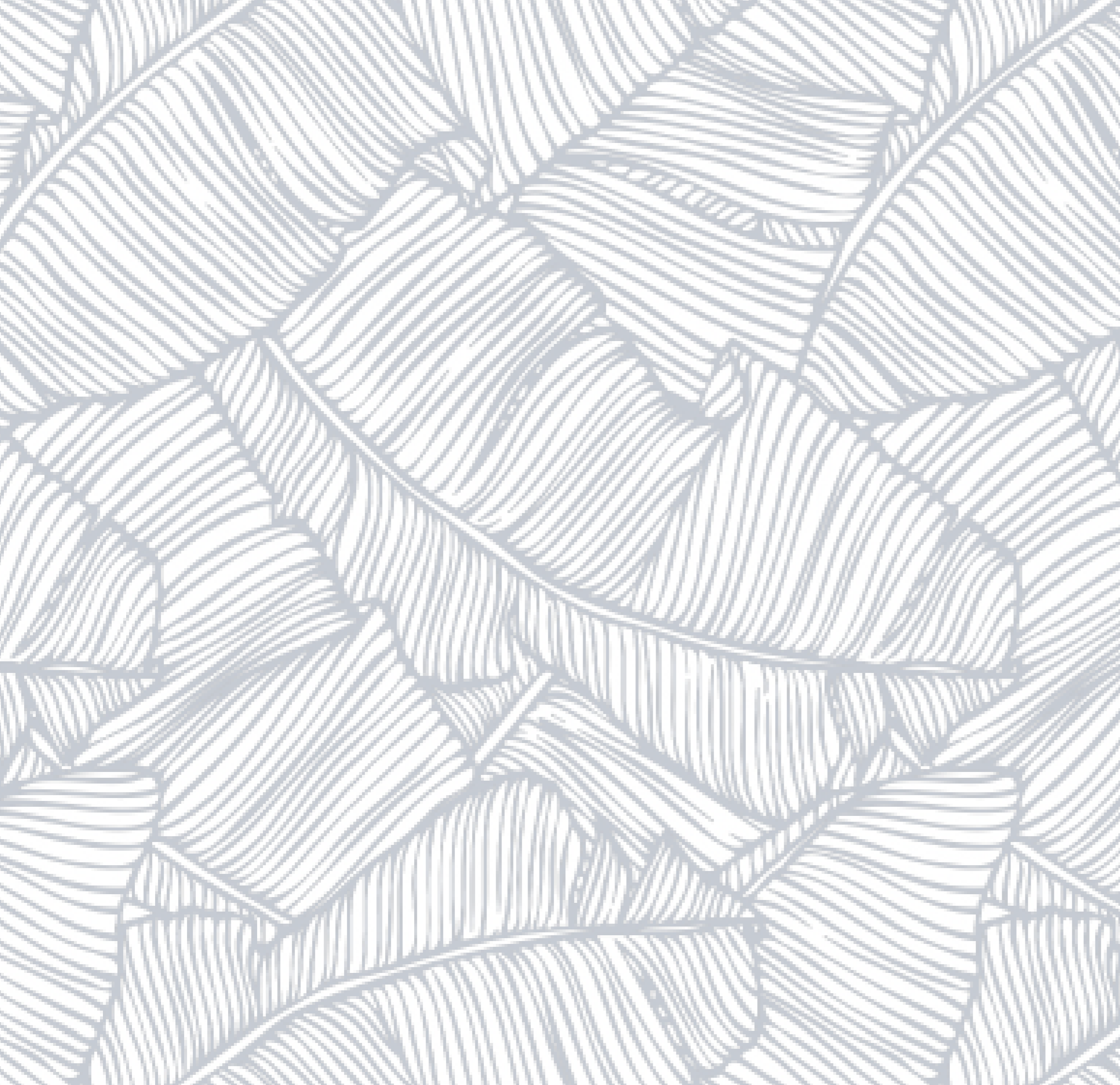

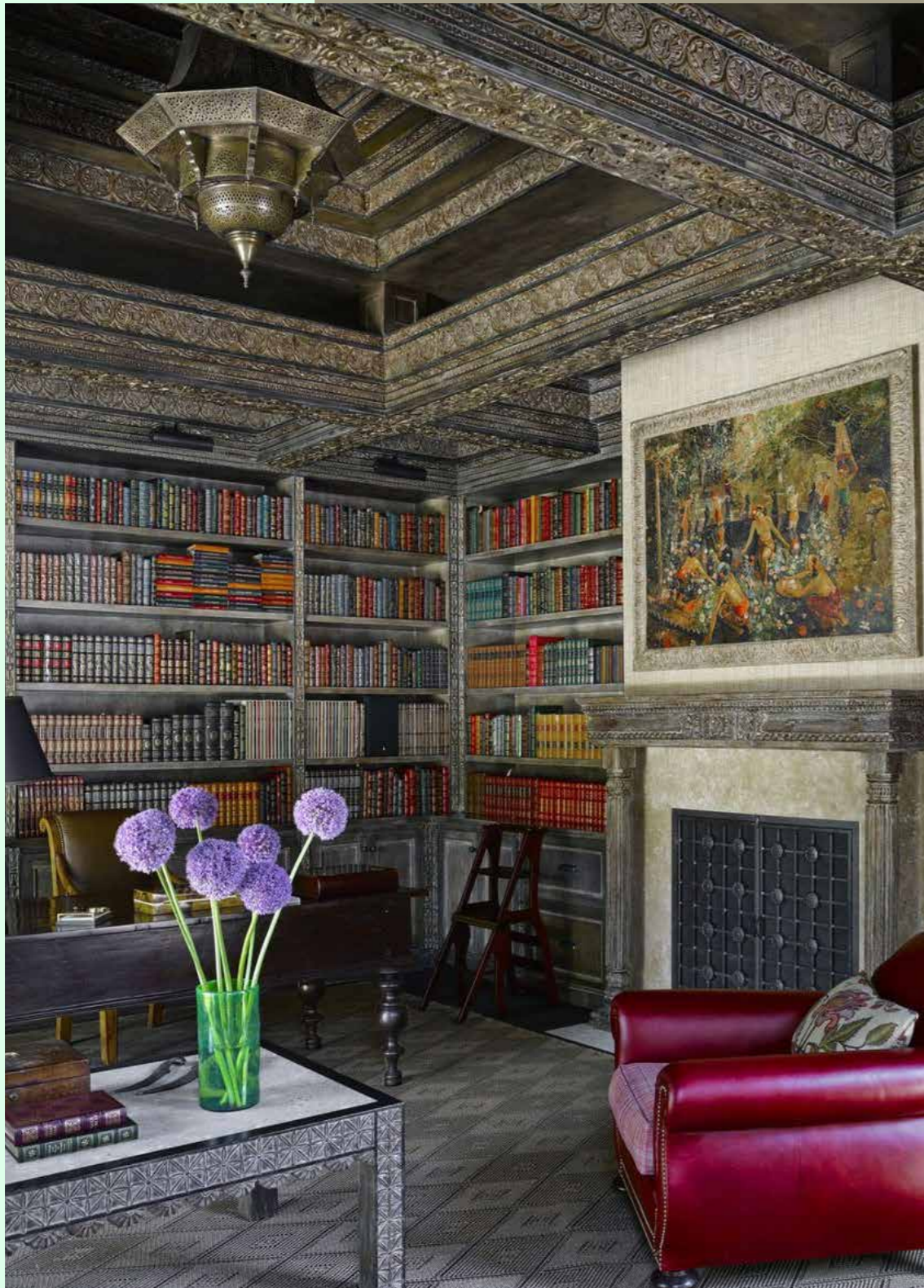
ORGANIZING IDEAS TO GIVE YOUR OFFICE

THE ULTIMATE UPGRADE

BACKDROP OF BOOKS

Anchor a soaring ceiling with walls filled with books. The space will feel less cold but just as grand. It also provides a tidy space for an extensive library.



MULTIPLE WORKSTATIONS

Identical built-in work spaces leave the floor open and add symmetry to a room. They're also a gorgeous solution for keeping a working family organized.



SPRAWLING CENTER TABLE

Something about an all-white space gives the impression of sleek minimalism, whether your desk is covered in papers or not. Carve out even more desk space by placing a table in the middle of the room, perfect for group brainstorm sessions.



WALLPAPERED CEILING

Decorate the ceiling and windows with bold patterns while keeping the walls subtle and neutral to create a calming visual break near the work space.



MATCHING GEOMETRIC ART

Matching a 3D wall sculpture to small leaning prints creates a cohesive theme and color palette, establishing an aesthetically organized office.

REPURPOSED BAR CART

A repurposed bar cart doubles as a side table and a mobile miniature shelving unit for displaying your favorite accessories or keeping files organized away from the desk.



BRIGHTLY PAINTED BUILT-INS

Vibrant colors energize a dull office, while a glossy finish adds glamour. Wall-mounted mirrors and sconces bounce and reflect light for a brighter space.



WINDOWSILL STORAGE

Place your desk in front of a window so you can not only reap the benefits of a great view and some sun, but also the windowsill storage, too! Style books, boxes, or personal belongings for a unique space with equal amounts of functionality.



BOXED SHELVING

Opt for a design-heavy storage unit with a decorative motif that actually makes office organization fun.



VIBRANT AND ECLECTIC BOOKSHELF

Stock bookshelves with your favorite things for a maximalist style that is all your own.



CURVED CORNER DESK

Build your desk into the wall for an innovative and efficient use of space.

MINIMALISTIC AND RUSTIC

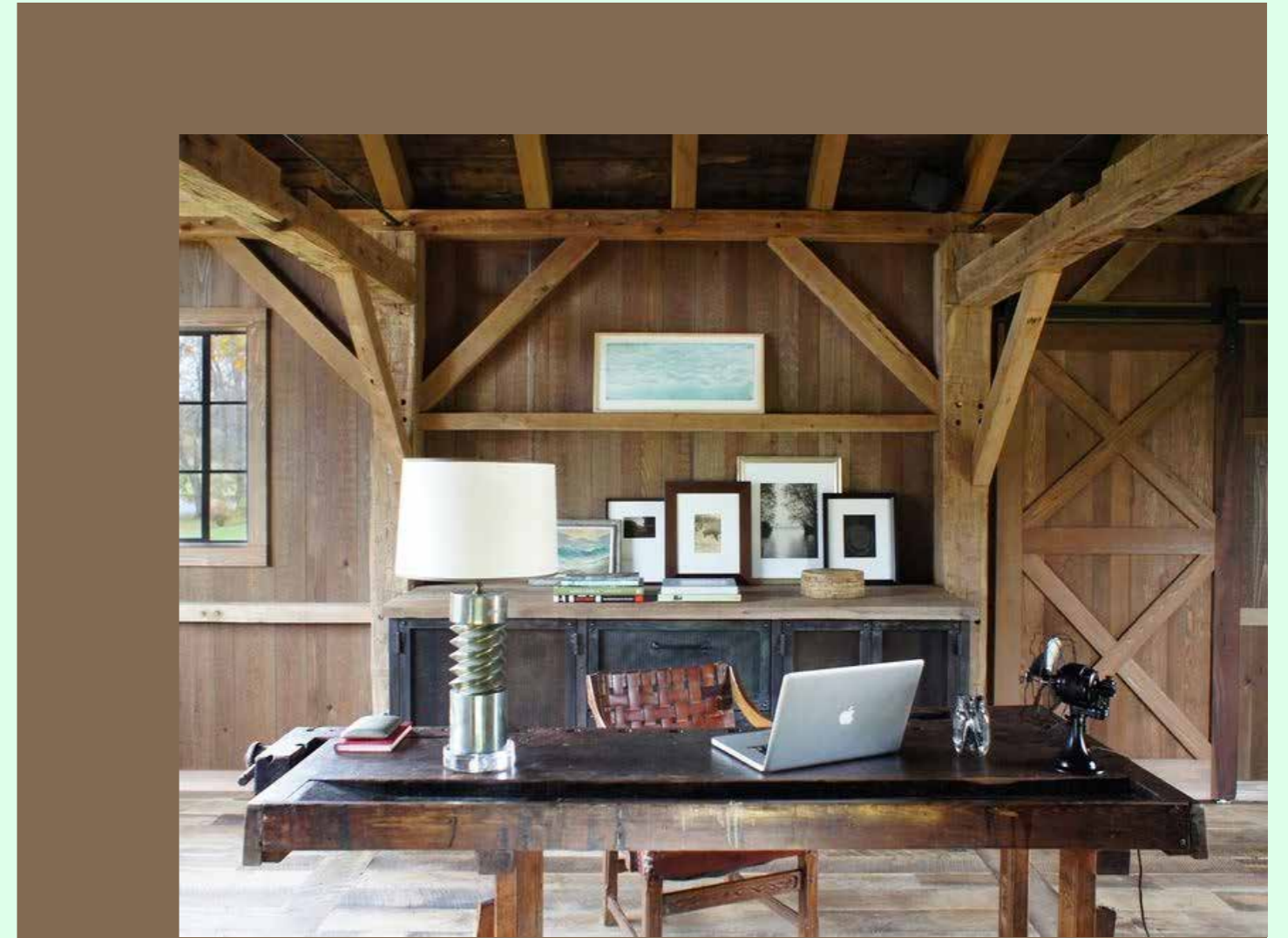
Keep your work space clean and simple by limiting furniture to the items you really need, like a single bookshelf and an extra-long desk.

Try styling books in different vertical and horizontal positions to create an eye-catching display.

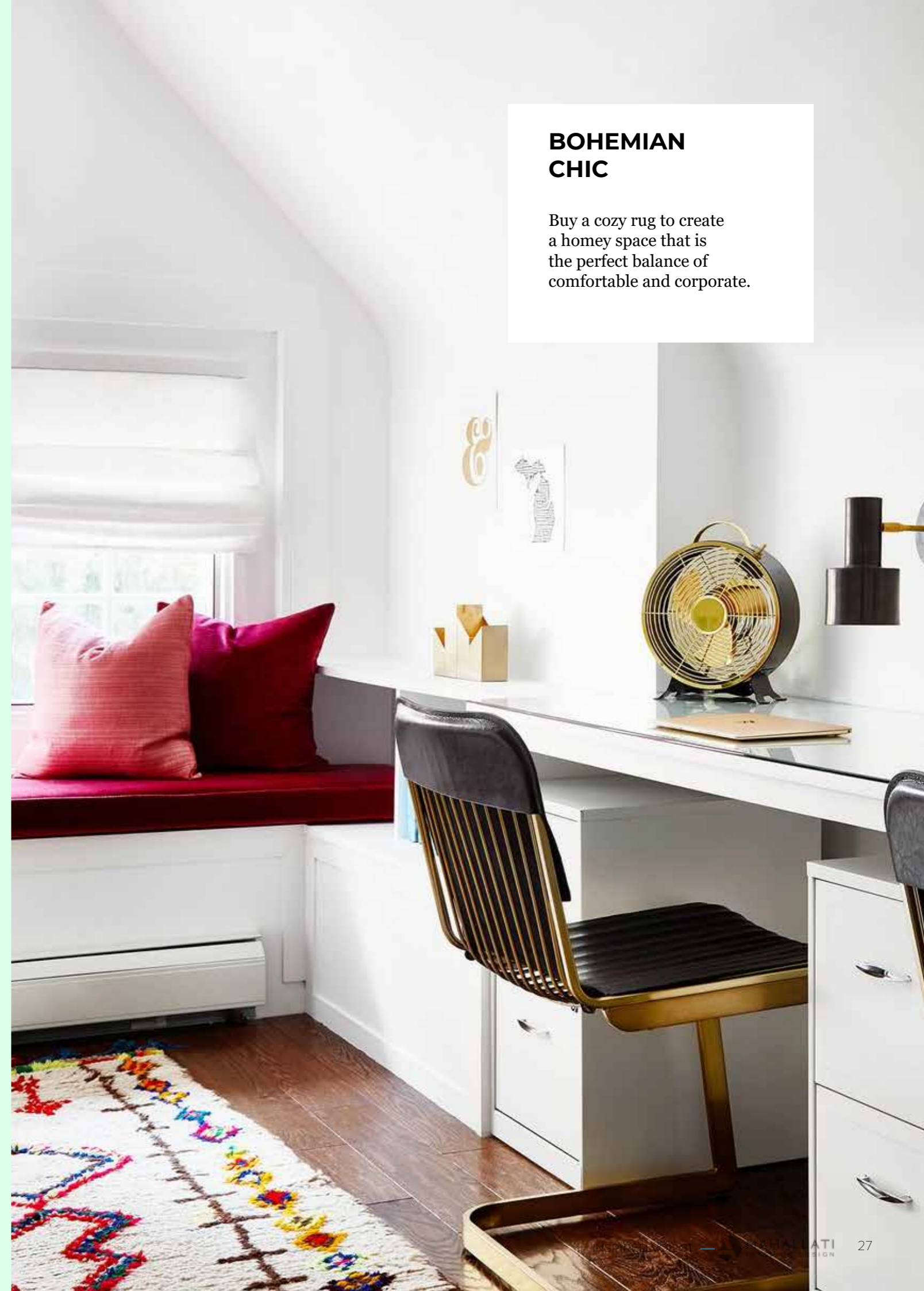
SIDE-TABLE STORAGE

BOHEMIAN CHIC

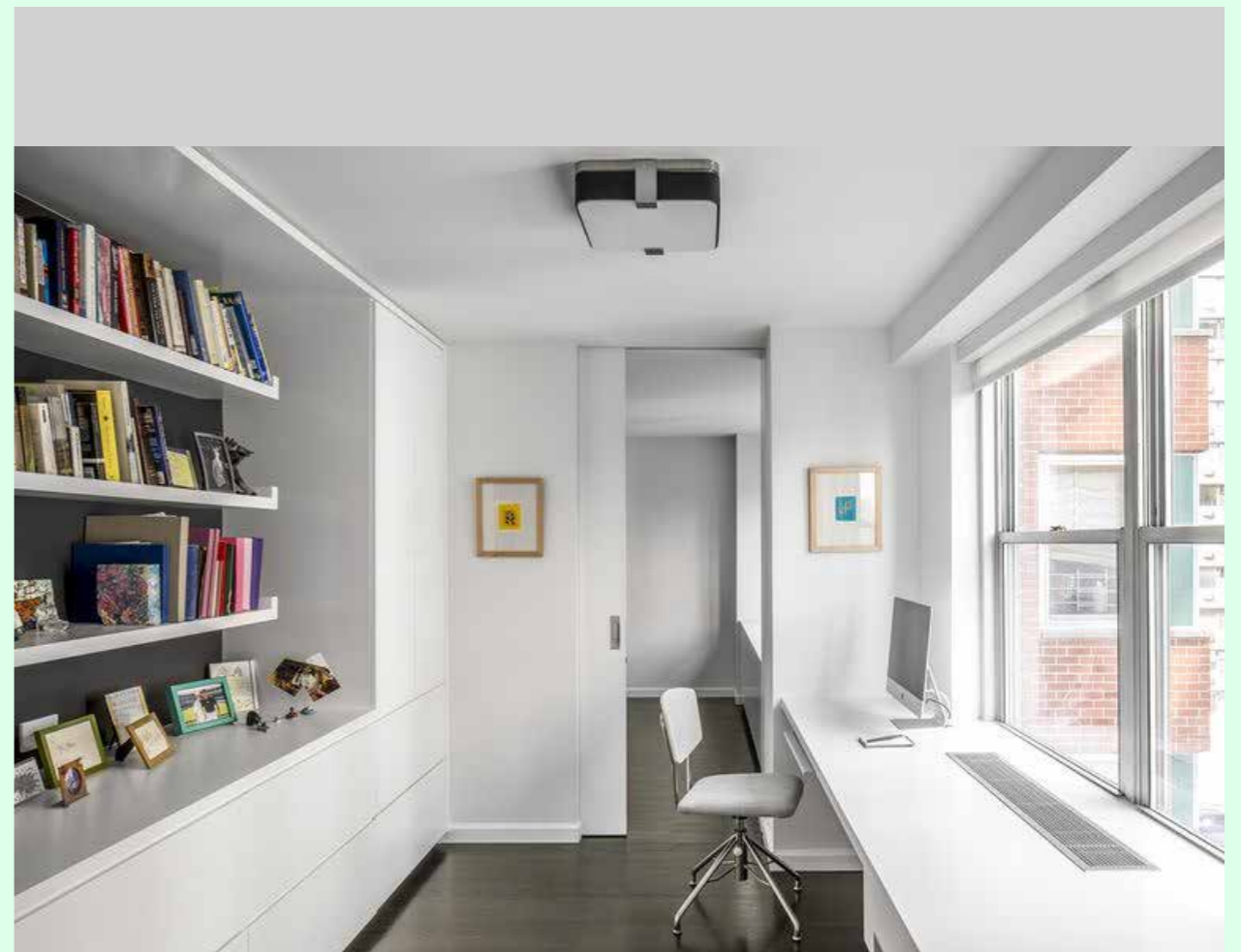
Buy a cozy rug to create a homey space that is the perfect balance of comfortable and corporate.

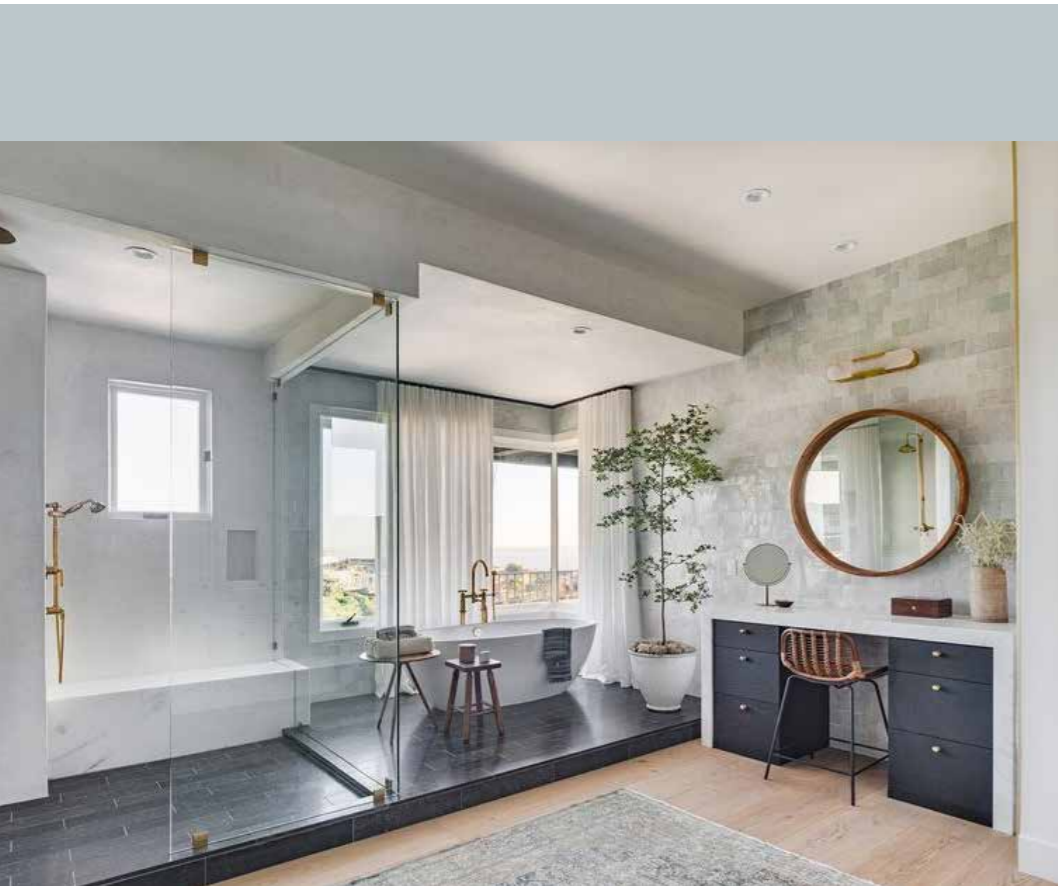

The wood vanity topped with a white modern sink has soothing vibes in this serene Napa Valley bathroom.



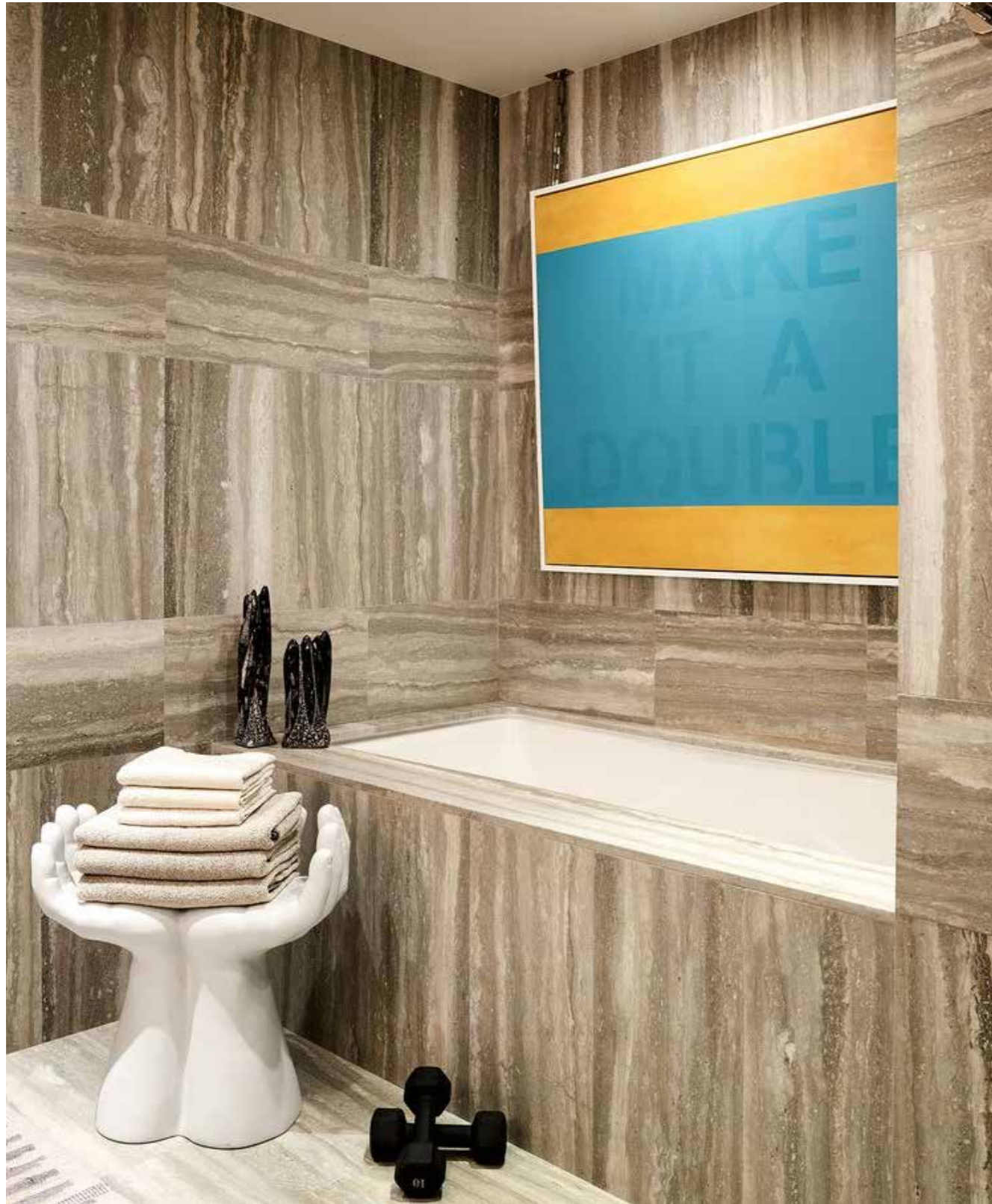
SERENE AND SIMPLE

ROOM WITH A VIEW

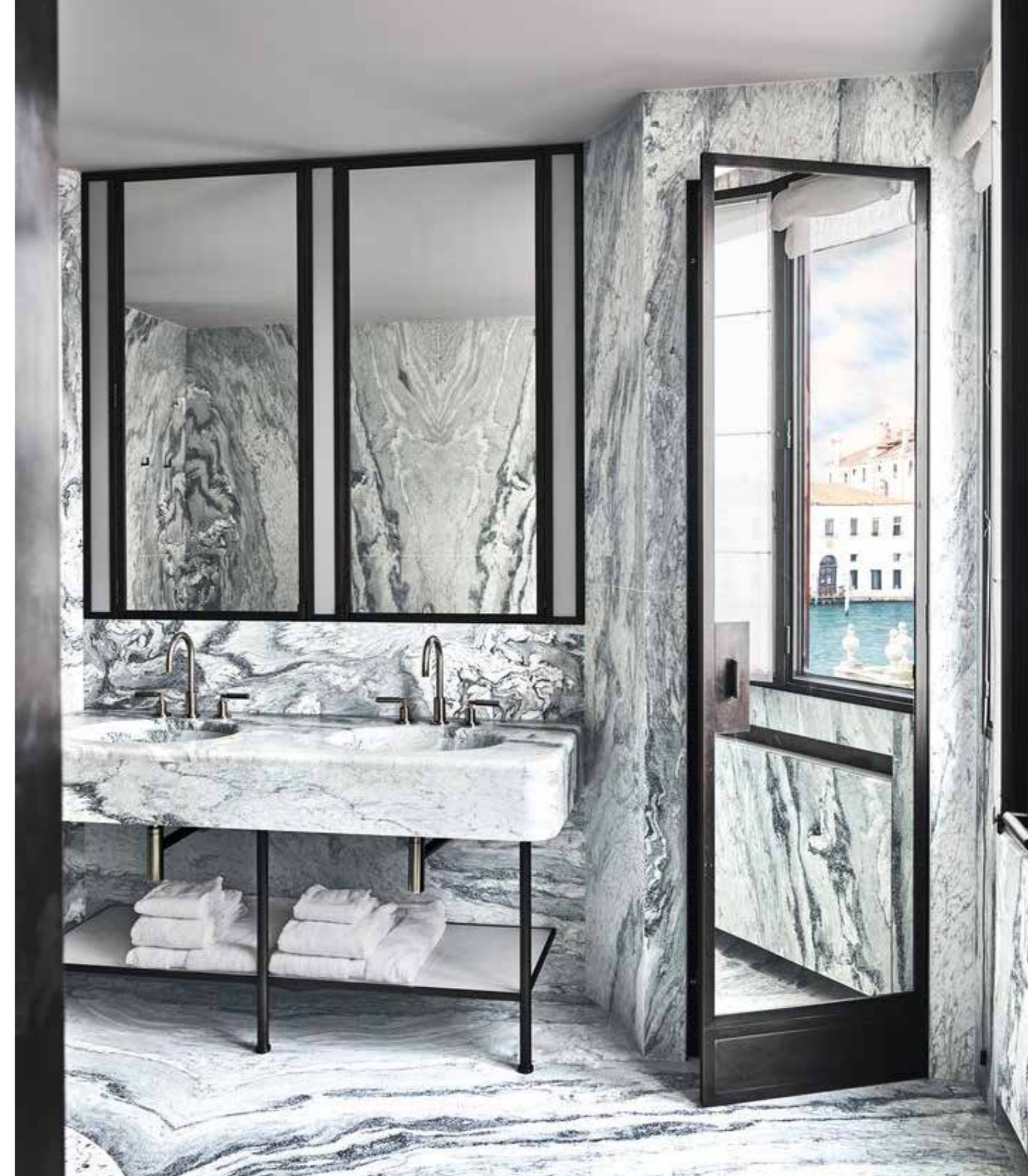
The large window opens up to a breathtaking view of the Golden Gate bridge in this San Francisco apartment. Wall-mounted handles were used for the sleek bathtub.

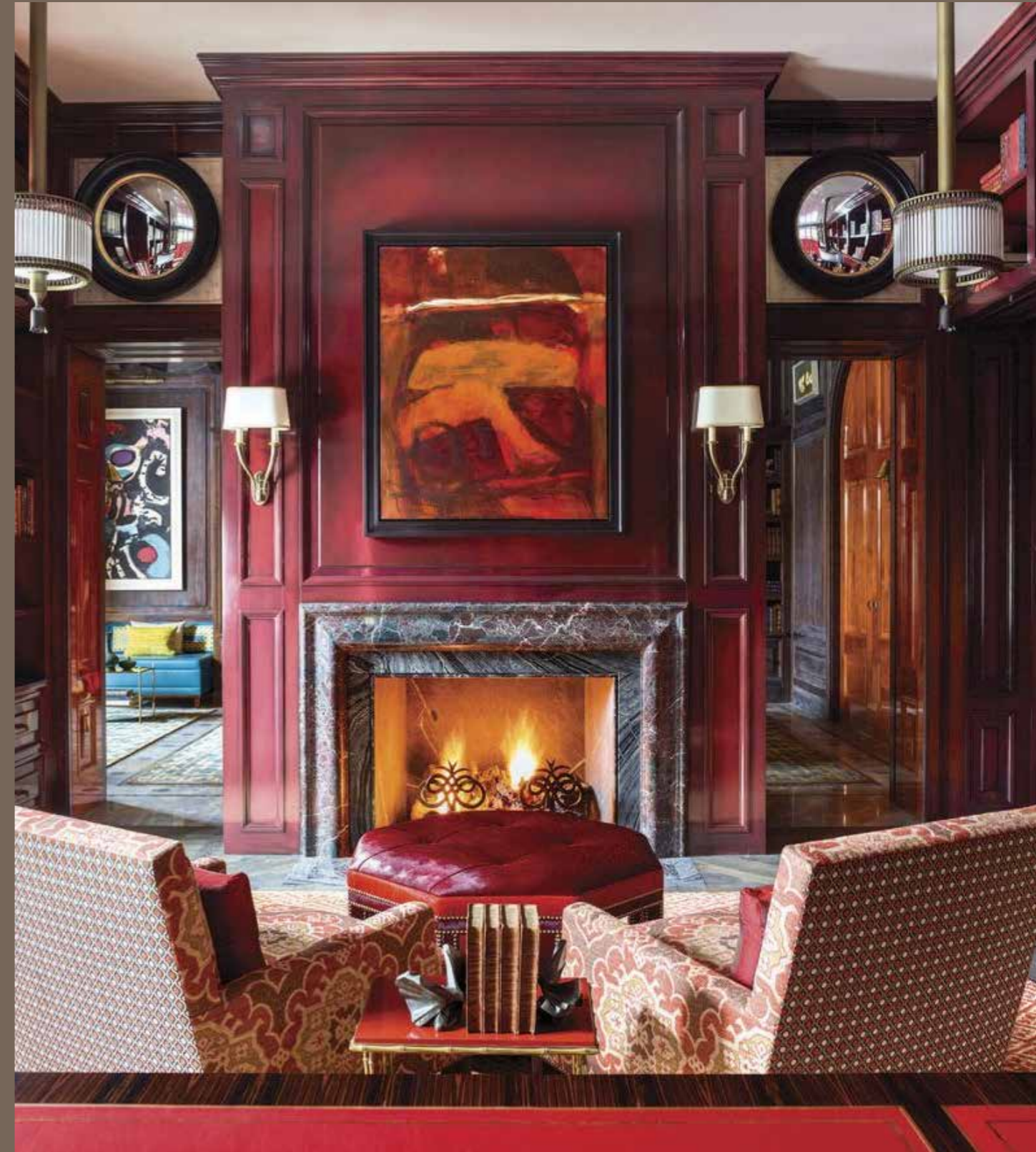
ART GALLERY OFFICE

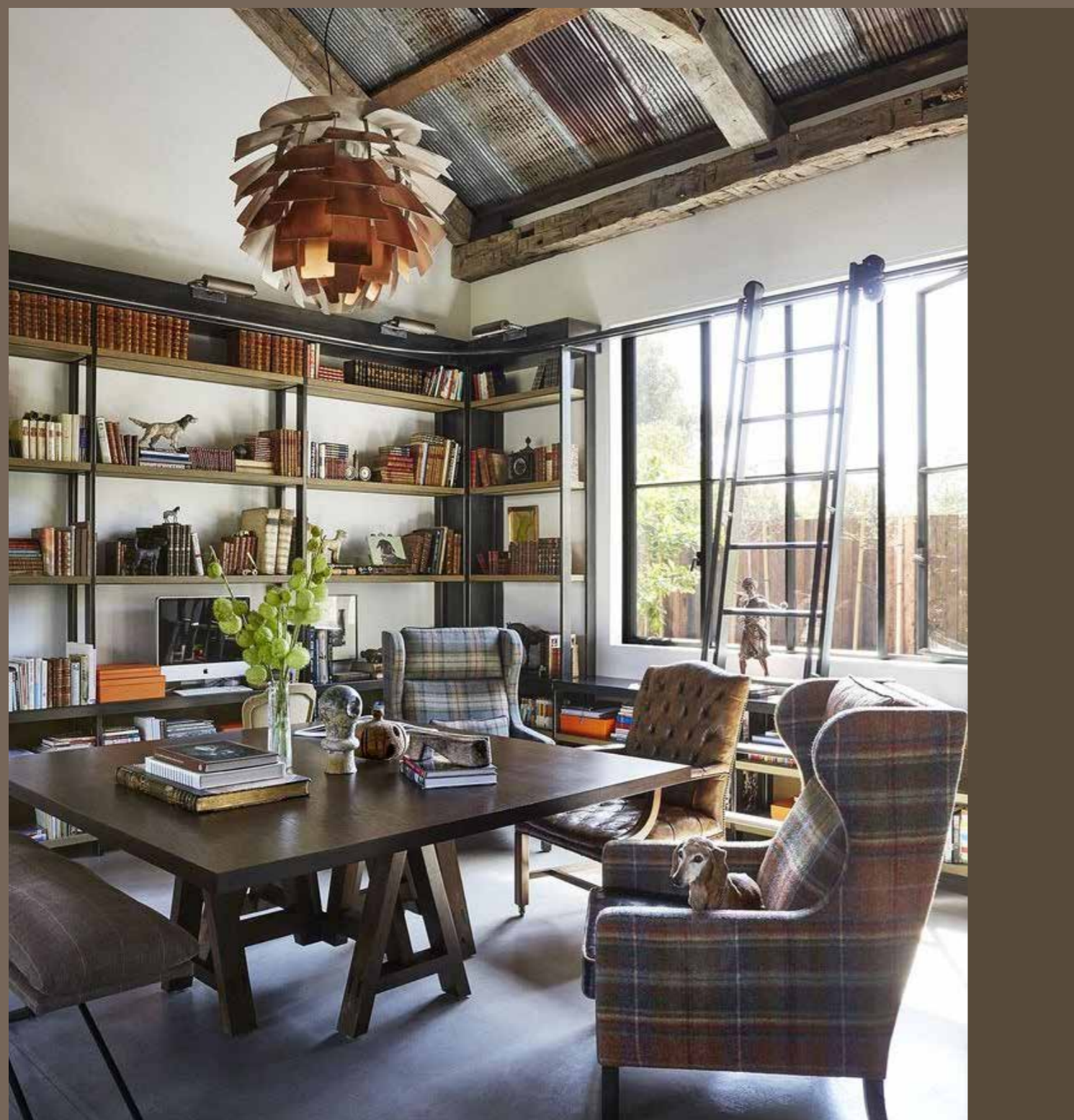
FORMAL LIBRARY OFFICE

ECLECTIC OFFICE

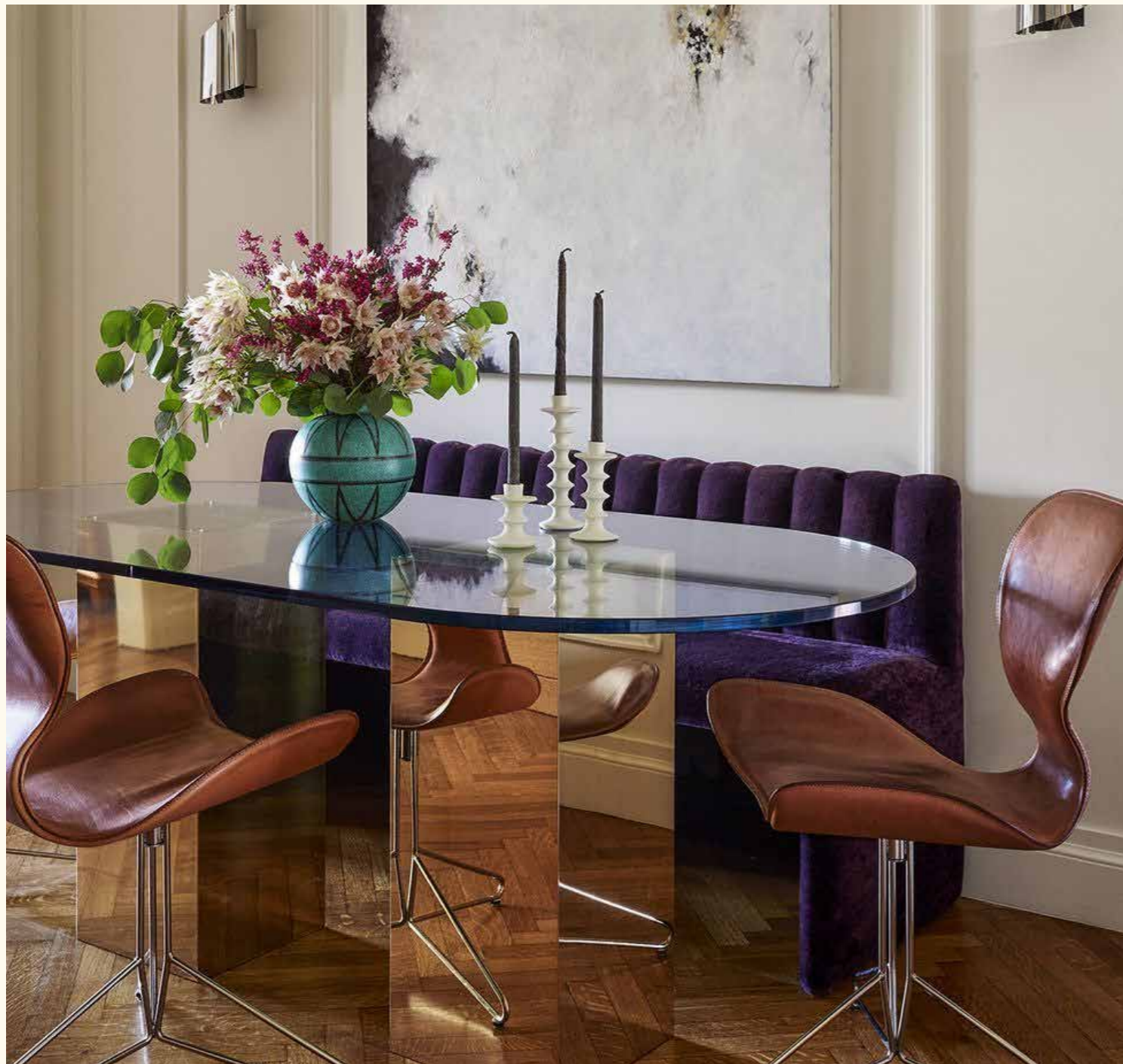

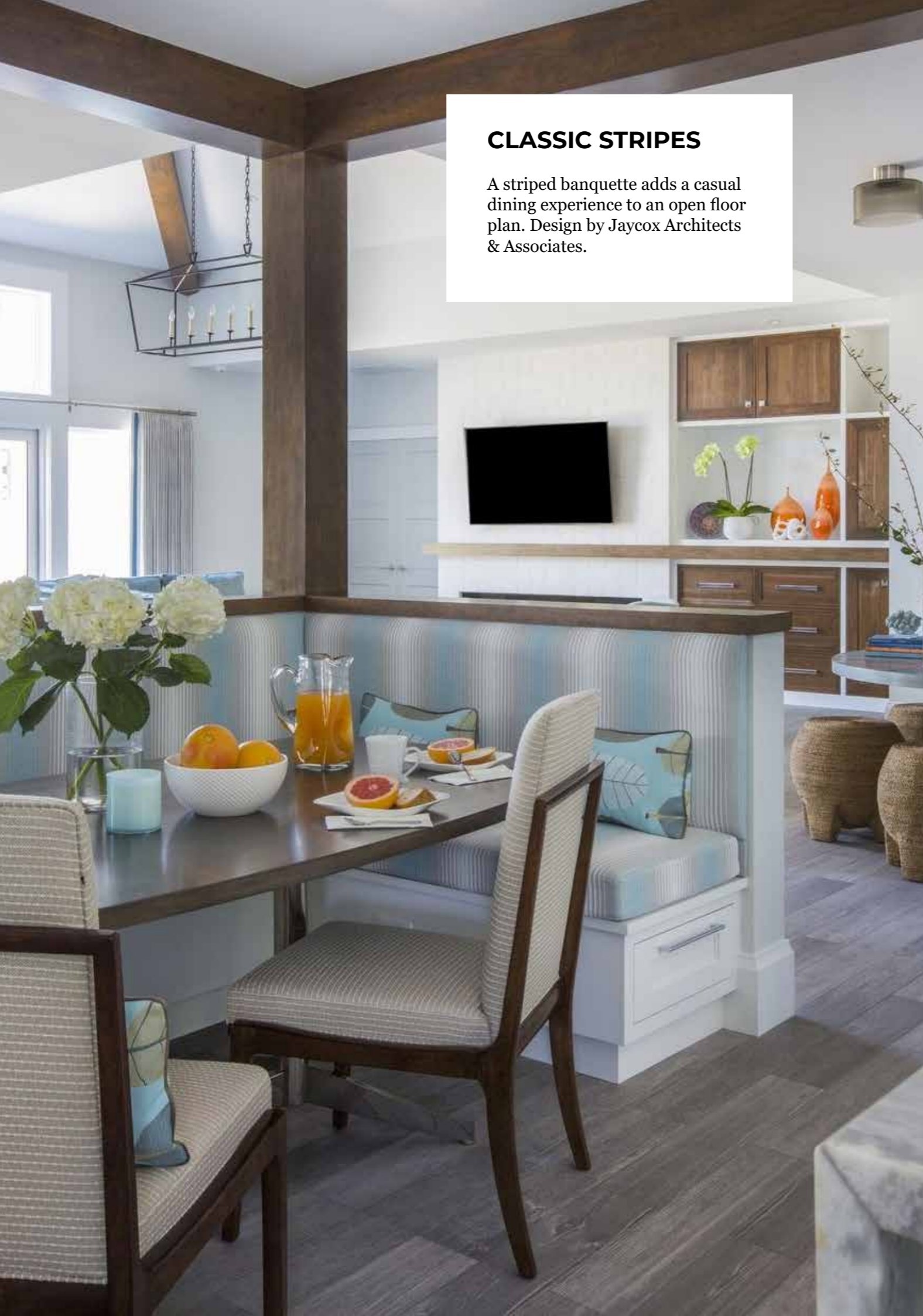


COBALT BLUE

A combination of banquette seating and bar stools add variety to this inviting kitchen crafted by Tineke Triggs / Artistic Designs for Living.



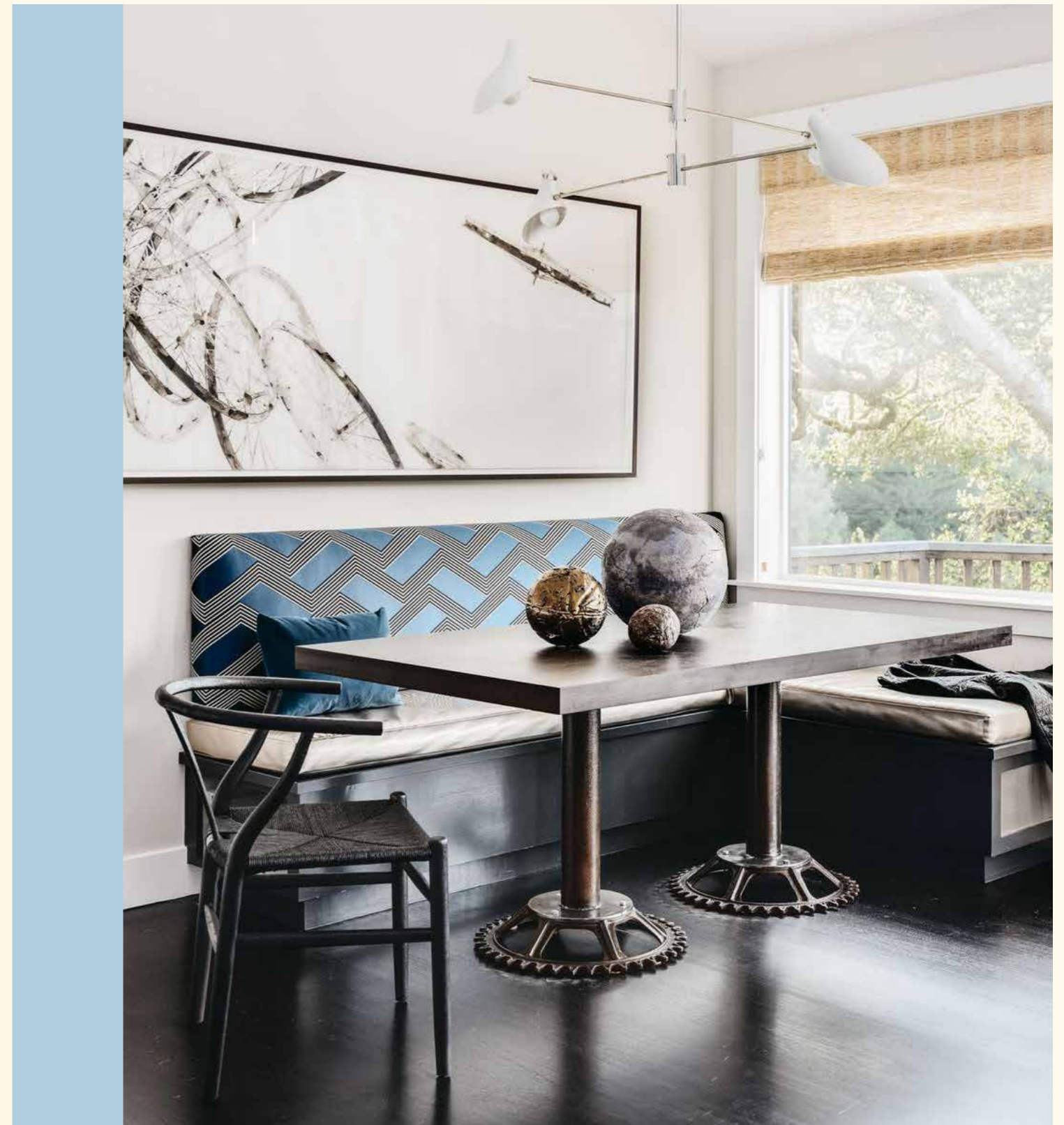
SLEEK LEATHER
